



FIRST AID

1 - Designate one or more FDP (First Destination Point) depending of the size of the hunting territory. The main feature of a FDP must be that it is easily located by the rescue team (crossing, sports field, lookout, etc.).

2 - In the event of an accident, dial 18 (firefighters), 15 (SAMU, Vital emergencies) or 112 (Single European Emergency Number). On the phone, locate the accident by mentioning the town, the forest plot, specify hunting accident and the location of the FDP. Then describe the victim and finally never hang up first, leave your phone number.

3 - Vehicle parking : the paths should always be left open so that the emergency vehicle can access as close as possible to the accident.

Meaning of horns signals

1 signal Driven hunt start

4 signals Immediate cessation of hunting

2 signals Driven hunt end

Repeating yourself the signals is also a way for more safety

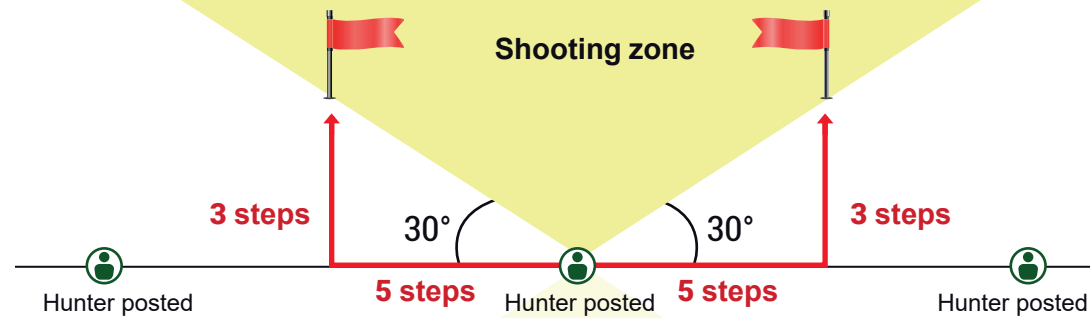


SAFETY RULES

- 1 - You must be in possession of your validated hunting licence and your insurance certificate.
- 2 - You must comply with the instructions given to you by this driven hunt regulation and the specific instructions of the warrant officer, president, fighter captain or linemaster.
- 3 - Wearing a fluorescent clothing in red or orange is mandatory.
- 4 - While driving, your weapon must be unloaded and stored in a bag or guncase or the disassembled.
- 5 - During walking, your weapon must be visible, out of the gun sleeve, unloaded, broken, breech open or disassembled.
- 6 - Once you arrive at the stand, you must face the drive to shoot behind you, you will immediately mark your shooting angle by respecting the 30 degrees (5 steps left and right and 3 steps backward).
- 7 - You must contact your neighbours in order to locate their shooting angle but also to be spotted by them. (See and be seen)
- 8 - As soon as the drive begins, any movement will be prohibited until the announcement of the end of the hunt. Once seated, do not place your weapon on your lap or seat. Under no circumstances the barrel can be pointed at the neighbour.
- 9 - You will be able to shoot as long as all safety rules are implemented, unless the line leader advises otherwise.
- 10 - The first two hunters stationed at each corner are obliged to shoot behind them unless the line leader advises otherwise.
- 11 - Shooting in the drive is prohibited unless the line leader advises otherwise.
- 12 - It is forbidden to sweep the line of hunters with the weapon shouldered.
- 13 - Identify the game perfectly before shooting and never shoot without identifying. 1
- 14 - All shots must be fired with background and at close range. Never shoot sitting in a seat.
- 15 - Don't endanger your hunting companions and other nature users. Don't shoot if the dogs are too close to the game.
- 16 - It is forbidden to shoot after the two signals. You have to follow the blows of the trumpet.
- 17 - It is imperative that the station returns to report to him and carry out the shots. Never follow an injured animal for more than 50 metres.
- 18 - Mark and report the direction of escape of an injured animal.

The beaters leader has the option of carrying a hunting weapon provided he has completed the "Chief of Hunt" training provided by the Federation of Hunters.

In the case of two teams of beaters, there is the possibility of having two tracking officers who can carry a hunting weapon but always for the sole purpose of killing an injured animal.

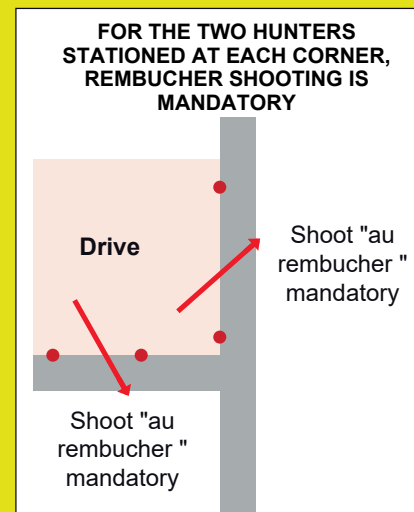


Respect for the 30 degree shooting angle

(Defined by the Prefectural Order of July 26, 2019)

An additional guarantee of safety

The Hunters Federation of Bas-Rhin recommends that you mark the 30-degree angle with a pennant or other neon object whenever possible.



➔ When hunting, call the dogs that come out of the drive and at the end of the hunt, please bring them back to the gathering place.

➔ Under no circumstances you should move a dead animal that is subject to the hunting plan, which is not marked.

➔ When hunting small game, there are a few additional safety rules that are required:

- To cross a ditch or pass over an obstacle, break your rifle and take out the cartridges.
- In front of you, hunters and companions must progress together and respect a perfect line.
- A game that tramples should never be shot.
- Never shoot at man's height. A 45-degree upward angle is recommended.
- When turning back, the angle of fire must be greater than 30 degrees because the lead sheaf "water" more than a bullet.
